Project Description: Do you enjoy spending time outdoors and interacting with people? We are seeking individuals to assist the Nebraska Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln with a long-term study examining angler behavior. This project aims to identify how anglers influence fish communities and how these fish communities respond to angling. As part of this effort, we are looking for individuals to collect information from anglers through in-person surveys at one of the following Nebraska reservoirs.

Lake Ogallala

Harlan County Reservoir

Merritt Reservoir

Davis Creek Reservoir

Sherman Reservoir

Calamus Reservoir

Sutherland Reservoir

The research-nature of this project requires that interviews take place on randomly selected days within each month (April-October). The assigned work schedule will vary from week to week. Interviews must be performed on 10 weekdays and 6 weekend days (per month), as well as on holiday weekends (July 4, Memorial Day, and Labor Day). Each day will consist of an approximately 8-hour shift in either the morning or the afternoon. The position starts March (11th or 25th) and runs through November 15th, 2023. The successful candidates will work closely with local fisheries biologists. Job duties include on-site angler surveys and data entry.

Pay: Starting around \$18.50 per hour

Qualifications: Prospective employees are subject to all University of Nebraska-Lincoln hiring requirements including, but not limited to, driving and criminal background checks. Must possess a valid driver's license with a "clean" driving history and will be required to drive on the job. Previous survey experience is not required.
